History of the Corvette Center: Horses & Horsepower...

The Corvette Center is Colorado's premier sales, maintenance, and restoration Corvette Center. We opened our doors in 1975, and cater to all present Corvette owners, and future Corvette owners. We began in Madison, Nebraska, a very small town in the North East corner of the state. Despite the size of the town, we had a full service Corvette facility. We expanded to Colorado Springs in 1986 when we purchased the Colorado Springs Corvette Center. We consolidated our operations in 1991 and changed the name to Corvette Center of Colorado Springs.

We provide parts and accessories to local and mail order customers. Additionally, our service department services and restores all years of Corvettes from 1953 through the current models. We also have a large inventory of previously owned vehicles for sale.

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History of the Corvette Center:

In 2005, we sold our property and building in Colorado Springs' Motor City. We purchased the Cactus Creek ranch at this time and located the Corvette Center and our personal homes to the 85 acre property. This new location is now closer to our customers in Pueblo, and we now have room to spread out our operations.



We are in the process of returning the 85 acre horse property to its original glory. In 1984 Cy Rickels purchased the land and built a world class equestrian establishment. Then called Bara Farms, it was developed to compliment the neighboring Horse Racing track. This horse track has since been turned into the Pikes Peak International Speedway. It is currently used by many of the Corvette Customers for weekend autocrossing and road track experiences.
